Your Highest Priority > 1 Timothy 5:17-6:2

5:17-18 Just as Paul wrote of honoring widows, now he writes of honoring those who build the church up through preaching and teaching, which is worth the support of God's people.

5:19-20 Yet this same overseer must be faithful. Accusations should not be entertained unless they are well grounded with factual witnesses. When those accusations are found to be true, a leader of God's people must be held accountable.

5:21-23 Timothy is to live according to these teachings, though they won't be popular. Part of that will involve being patient and thoughtful with who is placed into leadership.

5:24-25 The goal behind not moving too quickly is because the Lord often uses time to reveal reality.

6:1-2 Widows, overseers, and now those who are bond-servants. Contrary to what we might think, their highest priority isn't freedom, but instead it is their Christian witness and the Lord's glory.

Context: Paul's examples about how the family of God should live continue by speaking of overseers and bond-servants.

Aim: God's people must see that their highest priority is His honor – not their own, not their opinions, not their desires.

Gospel: Christ is not only worthy of all honor, but He also perfectly exampled what it is to be a servant. We must ask the Spirit to make us like our Master.

Applications: How can you better honor church leaders? How will you honor God when life doesn't go "according to plan"?
