Beginning With Moses > Luke 24:13-27

24:13-16 Luke writes of two disciples traveling on the road. Jesus joins them, though they don't recognize Him. This should tell us something crucial: sometimes what we need most isn't the quick easy answer, or the immediate reveal. Instead, what Jesus intends is what's best – for them and us.

24:17-24 While the basic factual outline that Cleopas gives is correct, we can easily detect that something isn't quite right in his understanding: he believes that God has promised a Messiah, and he had hoped that Jesus was that Messiah, but Cleopas is confused and concerned over Christ's suffering and death. Even an empty tomb isn't enough to give him hope.

24:25-27 Christ's point? Rather than revealing Himself directly, he calls these two disciples to hear from the Scriptures again: the Messiah had to suffer and die in this way, that was part of the plan all along.

Context: This scene occurs after Christ's resurrection but before his ascension into heaven.

Aim: Luke wants us to see that our faith needs to have depth and roots to it that go beyond a few facts about Jesus here or there. Instead, we must have the whole picture of our Messiah if we are to see Him correctly.

Gospel: Jesus is gracious to these disciples – and to us – who so often miss the big picture. Part of His grace is to call us to look again at the record of Him throughout the Bible.

Applications: Is your picture of Christ as big as the whole Bible's testimony? How will you grow in believing this?
