

A Son Over God's House > Hebrews 3:1-6

3:1-2 Faithful like Moses. In Jewish thinking, older was better. This is because “older” meant looking back to God’s promises and mighty works in the past. Yet, the reality is that Moses (i.e. “older”) isn’t the standard. Instead, just as Moses was faithful to the Lord, even more is Christ faithful in every way.

3:3-4 More glory than Moses. What’s more, Jesus isn’t on par with Moses – instead, He radically eclipses Moses in every way! This isn’t because Moses didn’t add up; instead, it is because Christ is perfect and worthy of our worship.

3:5-6 Faithful over Moses. Because of this, we read that Moses was a faithful servant in God’s house. Yet, Christ is greater: He is a Son, and therefore has authority over God’s house. We can be a part of that “house” (family, household, generation) by trusting in and clinging to Christ.

Context: The author of Hebrews has spent the last two chapters demonstrating how Christ is greater than any angel and is the best High Priest; now, he shows us how Christ is even greater than Moses.

Argument: Christians are to walk with confidence and hope as they rest in Christ’s own supreme faithfulness.

Gospel: Christ’s faithfulness means our sins are forgiven and His promises to us shall stand firm. Jesus is better than any other hero, and His work is given to all who believe.

Applications: Is Christ your “hero”? Do you think of Him as first and foremost compared to all others? Then worship Him!
