

Greater than Moses > Hebrews 3:1-6

3:1-2 *Think on Jesus.* The author wants his readers to now think deeply about Jesus: what are people called by God to think of His Son? We must see Him as the One who has been purposefully sent by the Lord to rescue His people from their sins. A mission He is perfectly suited for as our High Priest.

3:3-4 *Jesus is greater than Moses.* Christ's faithfulness and Moses' faithfulness have a number of parallels, yet Jesus is ultimately greater than Moses. How so? It's because Jesus is the builder of God's people, He is the One with the plan because He is not only man, but also Creator God.

3:5-6 *Jesus is the faithful Son.* The comparison now turns into a contrast: Moses was indeed faithful in the role that God gave to Him, yet Christ Himself is God, and therefore has been faithful over God's people in even greater ways.

Background: Because Jesus is able to help us on account of His divinity and humanity, we now read of the ways in which His perfect greatness benefits us.

The Point: We will enjoy the greatness of Christ if we remain faithful in Him.

Head: Jesus is greater than anyone else, even the most influential people in our lives or in history.

Heart: Christ's greatness calls us to trust Him and respond to Him as not just another "great" person, but as our King.

Hands: How will you "boast" of Christ's greatness this week?
