God's Son > Exodus 4:18-31

4:18-20 *God prepares.* The Lord doesn't simply call Moses and then send him our empty-handed. Rather, God provides all that is needed for Moses to be obedient to his task.

4:21-23 *God plans.* In a remarkable blessing, the Lord both reminds Moses of what he has already said and also reassures Moses of the plan. Pharaoh's opposition isn't to be any great surprise. Rather, Moses only needs to be obedient.

4:24-26 How God rescues. Moses has been disobedient to God's covenant promises, so how could he ever be a leader of God's people? The answer is that – just like with our salvation – Moses is rescued by the actions and blood of another. God's provision for him will mark him for the rest of his life.

4:27-31 *Responding to God.* Unlike what Moses feared, the leaders of the Hebrews believe the words from God and are reassured by them. Their response is to worship.

Background: God's call of Moses sets him on a path of returning to Egypt and confronting Pharaoh.

The Point: God's plan is for the rescue of his people – he is a Father to them and they are his son.

Head: Know that God's power and work are for your good.

Heart: Believe that obedience is the way to blessing.

Hands: Respond to the Lord's call on your own life with belief, obedience, and worship.
